# Pistol (Semi-Auto) Ladder Season 2

### AVAILABE TO ALL NEW/INTERMEDIATE/ADVANCED SHOOTERS

Whether you are just a brand-new shooter or an advance marksman; the goal is for improvement, and community (social activity with other shooters) This type of competition has many benefits that can be enjoyed by all levels of shooters. The ladder is sponsored by the local CMP 24952.

Ladder members try to work their way up the ladder throughout the season by scoring more competitively against other ladder members. If you challenge someone and are successful, you take their position on the ladder, and they are bumped done one (1) rung on the ladder. Seasons will last three (3) months. Each pistol classification ladder and required minimum of individuals for each of the classification ladders each season is listed below.

A cash award is present at the end of each session. Minimum of fifty dollars (\$50.00). There is the option for more prizes when the category gets at least two more competitors above the current number of competitors. Competitors will supply their own ammunition and required targets from the online website link.

### **PISTOL LADDER REGULATIONS**

- 1. Each ladder member must challenge any ladder member that is above them in the ladder standings at least once (1) a month. A person in number one (1) ladder position has no one to challenge but needs to accept challenges from any member as much as their time permits. The first-place person cannot just camp out and not accept challenges.
- 2. Failure to challenge monthly will move you to the bottom of the list.
- 3. Both members must agree to the date, location, and time of the match.

- 4. Both ladder members must shoot the challenge at the same time. They can either use the same lane or two (2) lanes next to each other.
- 5. The higher ladder member will supply two targets of their choice of the <u>possible required</u> targets. Targets will list round count, directions and distances. Targets may only be outlined once (< .25") inside the original line.
- 6. Ready positions target definitions: Compressed ready Hold the firearm with two hands, bend your elbows, and rest them by your sides. Keep the muzzle pointed downrange. Low ready Keep the muzzle low enough to point the gun in a safe direction, but still be able to see what's in front of you. For example, the aggressor's feet. This position allows you to shoot quickly if the situation requires it.
- 7. If you are the challenged person, it does NOT count as a monthly challenge requirement.
- 8. The higher ladder person can decide stand or sit (no external resting).
- 9. After the shooting is completed the two competitors will each sign both targets and have their targets turned into the CMP match director for scoring and recording by the director. The directors' decision is final.
- 10. The match winner may possibly move up the ladder.
- 11. Each match competitor may challenge any person on the ladder in the same month.
- 12. To be eligible for a prize, each competitor is required to complete a challenge each month.
- 13. Any person joining after the start of a session will be placed at the bottom.
- 14. Previous ladder members will use last season's standing (placement/handicap) for new season.
