



# Rifle Ladder – 2025-2026

The goal OF THIS Rifle Ladder is for improvement and community (social activity with other shooters). This type of competition has many benefits that can be enjoyed by all levels of shooters. The ladder is sponsored by the local CMP 24952.

Scenario: **Ladder** members try to **work** their way up the ladder throughout the season by scoring accurately against other **ladder** members. Season will last three (3) months. Competitors will supply their own ammunition and the required targets from the online website link. Each rifle classification ladder and **required minimum of three (3) individuals for each of the classification ladders each season** is listed below.

A cash award is present at the end of each session. Minimum of forty dollars (\$40.00). There is the option of more prizes when the category gets at least two more competitors above the current number of competitors.

## RIFLE LADDER REGULATIONS

1. Each ladder member must challenge any ladder member that is above them in the ladder standings at least once (1) a month. A person in number one (1) ladder position has no one to challenge but needs to accept challenges from any member as much as their time permits. The first-place person cannot just camp out and not accept challenges.

2. Failure to challenge monthly will move you to the bottom of the list.
3. Both members must agree to the date, location, and time of the match.
4. Both ladder members must shoot the challenge at the same time. They can either use the same lane or two (2) lanes next to each other.
5. The higher ladder member will supply two targets of their choice of the [possible required targets](#). Targets will list round count, directions and distances. **Targets may only be outlined once (< .25") inside the original line.**
6. Benched/Optic .22/Center Fire: both competitors may choose to use the option to recheck their optic with a sight in target prior to the actual ladder match.
7. Bench rifles must not touch the shooting table. Bags, rests, bi-pods, braces are optional.
8. Optic shots that cut the line will be scored at the lower point value\*.
9. **Lever Action Calibers: NO .22 Caliber.**
10. After the shooting is completed the two competitors will each sign both targets and have their targets turned into the CMP match director for scoring and recording by the director. The directors' decision is final.
11. The match winner may possibly move up the ladder.
12. Each match competitor may challenge any person on the ladder in the same month.
13. If you are a challenged person, it does NOT count as a monthly challenge requirement. You still must challenge someone.
14. To be eligible for a prize, each competitor is required to complete a challenge each month.
15. Any person joining after the start of a session will be placed at the bottom.
16. The previous ladder members will use last season's standing (placement/handicap) for new season.

*\*Except when otherwise stated on the target.*
